



A Message From the Program Director

Welcome back families and skaters. I am looking forward to the start of another great Kids On Ice[®] season. Each year, after we close in March, I review outcomes from the season that just ended and plan for the next. I also survey KOI parents to ensure our programs are meeting our mission and serving our families. As a result of survey feedback, Kids On Ice P.L.U.S will start its third season as "Positive Living Using Skating". (Speed, Hockey, Advanced Figure and Synchronized Skating.)

Why the change from Learning to Living? Survey results show the majority of P.L.U.S. skaters are excelling in school. The revamped P.L.U.S. is similar to athletic programs in academic settings with both training and academic requirements.

In order for skaters to participate in FDIA's free on-ice specialty classes, they will be required to participate in weekly 30 minute off-ice training sessions that focus on 1) agility, balance and coordination, 2) strength and power, and 3) flexibility with an overall goal of general wellness and injury prevention. Students must also maintain a 2.5 or higher GPA. Students who need academic support to improve their GPA will receive individualized tutoring in order to help them achieve academic success.

DC ranks in the top ten states with the highest rates of obese 10-17 year olds. In 2010, the city's rate of childhood obesity was 35%; rates in Wards 7 and 8 were 39%. Experts suggest that children should participate in at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous activity 5-7 days a week. Our new version of P.L.U.S. better serves this need. The kids were on the ice several times each day while incredible friendships and memories were made. It took about 15 minutes for the KOI kids to fit right in, and before you knew it there wasn't a group of North American kids and Israeli kids, but rather a group of hockey players. Our new friends in Israel couldn't have been better hosts, and made sure that our kids felt right at home.

On-ice sessions were run by 14-year NHL Veteran Laurie Boschman and 2010 Canadian Olympic gold medalist Tessa Bonhomme. Our kids had the opportunity to spend the entire trip with them, in addition to Mitch Miller, Andrea Boschman and a 2 young Canadian goalies named Jack Moore and Zach Springer. They couldn't have asked for a better group to travel and experience the country with.

Despite western media reports of in-country unrest and violence, our group felt entirely safe and at ease during their stay. Except for an airline delay due to mechanical problems that extended their stay by 24 hours, the group experienced not a single moment of anxiety or concern for their safety.

FDIA is incredibly grateful for all the financial support that made this trip possible. This once in a lifetime opportunity was a glorious one that these young men (and one old guy) will never forget. We look forward to expanding the exchange next year, taking new and more players.
